Buxton Sub-Aqua Club is a training branch of the British Sub-Aqua Club (BSAC), which, for over 60 years, has been the biggest diving club in the world.

Our club was formed in 1977 with the aim of supporting its members in the enjoyment of the various aspects of scuba diving. We are a non-profit organisation, relying on fees and subscriptions to maintain the equipment and facilities that we use for training and the pursuit of a wide range of skills development.

We meet every Wednesday evening in Buxton Swimming Pool at around 7.30pm, with pool sessions starting at 8.00pm and lasting for an hour. Then we go on to a local hostelry where social events are planned and held, as well as lots of talking about diving! We would be most pleased if you would like to join us at anytime on our training nights.

The British Sub-Aqua Club offers internationally-recognised qualifications, and anecdotal evidence shows that BSAC-trained divers are seen by many dive centres around the world to be highly competent and capable.

The courses leading to the different levels of qualification will teach you about the principles and practices of scuba diving with increasing degrees of responsibility and involvement. The overall aim is to provide you with the knowledge and understanding to go underwater with your dive buddy, to be able to plan your dive and to execute the plan safely so that you get maximum enjoyment out of the experience.

Our club enjoys the benefits of having a number of instructors who are able to teach diving up to the highest level. We can also offer a full range of specialist courses such as Wreck Appreciation, Underwater Photography, Boat Handling (*our club has its own boat*) and Equipment Care. The pace of the training is entirely up to you, but we aim to dive with you in open water as soon as you feel confident to take that step.

The club has a regular monthly trip to various open water sites which are particularly good for training, and throughout the year there are visits to dive in the sea at places such as Swanage in Dorset, Anglesey in Wales, and St. Abbs and Mull in Scotland. There have also been diving trips to Orkney (Scapa Flow), Turkey, Croatia, Egypt and Malta, and many of our members have dived in other, more exotic areas of the world.

As well as diving, the club is steadily building a number of fun and social events into the annual programme, including meals out, Go-Kart racing, and visits to a recompression chamber.



As well as our own dive boat, the club has a good number of dive kits for use by trainees and members. We also have full use of Buxton Swimming Pool every Wednesday for training purposes.
